- Money out of Politics: Public funding/financing for elections
- Gerrymandering fair proportional representation
- ERA passed

Creating a Healthier League Network

- •Two sessions with nonprofit attorney -
 - ✓ Nonpartisanship in hyperpartisan times

- •National board will provide guidance for state and local Leagues to assess risk in navigating nonpartisanship in their election and advocacy work.
- •National board will convene state League leaders to a work group to further investigate a set of standards or chartering agreement for Leagues
