What is Advocacy?

Goals:

Educate the public, voters, or policymakers on an issue or policy

Influence public opinion – building support for or opposition to a position or

policy

Influence legislation, policies, or regulations

Includes:

- Education
- Publicly supporting or opposing an issue
- Lobbying





Advocacy vs. Lobbying

Lobbying

- One type of advocacy
- An attempt to influence specific legislation or administrative action
- 1. Directed to a legislator, their staff, or another governmental employee
 - a. Expresses view on specific legislation or administrative action
- 2. Directed to the public
 - Expresses view on specific legislation or administrative action AND urge readers to contact respective government officials or employees
 - b. Expresses view on specific ballot measure



Executive Branch Structures




Federal Executive Branch

- President
- Executive Office of the President (e.g. CEQ, WHGPC)
- Cabinet
 - Vice President
 - Heads of 15 executive departments
 - Agriculture, Commerce, Defense, Education, Energy, Health and Human Services, Homeland Security, Housing and Urban Development, Interior, Justice, Labor, State, Transportation, Treasury, and Veterans Affairs
- Independent federal agencies and commissions (e.g. EAC, EPA)



Federal Executive Branch





State Executive Branch

All States have:

- Governor
- Attorney General
- Superintendent of Schools
- Public Service Commissioner
- Insurance Commissioner
- Agriculture Commissioner
- Labor Commissioner


Most States have:

- Secretary of State
 - State Board of Elections/State Election Commission
- Comptroller
- Treasurer
- Auditor
- Natural Resources Commissioner



State Executive Branch

- Some positions are elected
- Some positions are appointed
- Important to know whether you are dealing with elected or political appointees
 - How to strategize around making asks
 - How is this official likely to be influenced





Local Executive Branch

Government Tiers

- Counties
- Municipalities (e.g. cities, towns, boroughs, villages)

Government Forms

- Mayor-Council
- Council-Manager
- Commission



Purpose of Advocacy in the Executive Branch



Why Lobby the Executive Branch?

- Separation of powers/ checks and balances
 - The Constitution assigns different tasks to the branches
- Implementation of statute by agencies
 - Bipartisan Safer Communities Act implementation via ATF
 - Clean Air Act implementation via EPA
- Challenging legislative environment
 - Gridlock in legislature
 - Struggle with legislative results in the past



Legislative vs. Executive Advocacy



Legislators vs. Regulators

Legislators

- Enact laws
- Aren't specialists
- May need data breakdown

Regulators

- Monitor and enforce laws
- Are specialists
- May need context on broader impact

Legislative Advocacy

- Memos to legislators
- Meetings with legislators
- Legislative testimony
- Action Alerts
- Public policy briefs

Executive Advocacy

- Advising on Executive Order implementation
- Communicating directly with Chief Executive's office
- Comments on proposed rulemaking
- Influencing regulation development

State and local Leagues wishing to work on a federal issue or at the national level on an issue that has not been the subject of an LWVUS Action Alert can use this form to contact the national office to consult on the intended action.

- The proposed action and the message to be conveyed;
 a) If you are requesting to send or co-sign a letter, please attach that letter in the appropriate section of this form.
- 2. The LWVUS position on which the action is based:
- The timeline for action (e.g., sending the message or deadline for signing the letter): and
- 4. Details about other groups that are involved in this effort;
 a) If the request pertains to a regional issue, or the issue affects multiple Leagues, please coordinate with those affected Leagues before completing this form (for example, if multiple Leagues would like to sign a letter addressed to a Federal official, please acquire confirmation from each affected League that they will participate and then one League may submit this form on behalf of all affected Leagues).
- 5. Evidence that the issue is a priority for that state or local League. Evidence of an existing policy position is required. If a local League is requesting permission to contact its U.S. Senator(s) on an issue that has not been the subject of an LWVUS Action Alers, it should provide evidence that the action has been authorized by its state League. Additionally, if a local League is joining a coalition letter at the state level, you must also have sien-off from your state League.





Federal Action Requests

Advocacy Actions

- Communicating with an elected or appointed official
- Writing an op-ed or letter to the editor
- Joining a coalition
- Participating in a press conference or rally

Communication with Federal Officials

- Coalition letters to Members of Congress, the executive branch, etc.
- League letters to Members of Congress
- Meetings with federal officials
- Note: Officials must represent your jurisdiction




- Posted daily to announce updates from Federal executive agencies

State Administrative Registers

- Notices of agency rulemaking proposals and adoption:
 - Redistricting commissions
 - Power and electricity boards
 - Water boards
 - Flections boards
- Updated regularly
- Typically under the office of the secretary of state
- Find your state's register here

Executive Action: FY'25 Governor's Budget

- Affordable Housing legislative specialist Lori Stewart wrote a letter to Governor Healey, copying policy staff, requesting line-item funding for an Access to Counsel program
 - ATC ensures legal representation for low-income tenants who face eviction
- It worked! Staff replied and requested LWVMA continue advocating for the \$3.5M line item in the House and Senate budgets
 - Sent a letter to Chairs of House Ways and Means and Senate Ways and Means chairs this week advocating for the line item
 - Also supported via <u>testimony for Gov. Healey's housing bond bill</u>



Executive Action: End solitary confinement

- Criminal Legal System Legislative specialist Nancy Bettinger sent a letter to newly inaugurated Governor Healey to end the practice of solitary confinement in Jan 2023.
 - Refocus operations on education and rehabilitation
- Dept. of Corrections DOC Chair Carol Mici retiring soon
- Didn't receive feedback, but, they know where LWVMA stands



Executive Action: Climate Chief

- Legislative specialist Launa Zimmaro sent a letter to Climate Chief Hoffer
 - Advocating for a <u>public awareness campaign to educate all residents on the</u> state financial incentives to electrify
 - In person meeting at the State House within weeks after she was appointed
- Developed strong personal relationship and she answers emails and calls directly



Regulatory action: public comment

- MA Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) proposed a new Health and Physical Education Curriculum Framework
 - Including medically accurate, age-appropriate sex ed curriculum
 - Last updated in 1999
- Legislative Specialist Jan Soma submitted public comment on behalf of LWVMA
 - Working to pass Healthy Youth Act legislation for more than ten years
- Issued <u>Action Alert</u> asking our membership to submit public comment for DESE to approve the new curriculum framework



Executive Action: Prevent Private Jet Expansion

- Several local Leagues are working together within a larger coalition to prevent the expansion of Hansom Air Force Base to accommodate private jets
- Falls under the jurisdiction of MassPort
- Coalition hosted webinar educating public more than 500 registrants
- Participated in stand outs
- Submit public comment on MA EPA review

- Implementation of the <u>Voting Access Executive Order</u>
- Census Bureau Opposition to Reducing Scale of Census Survey
- Comments on <u>Healthy People 2030 Objectives</u>
- Office of Management and Budget proposal on <u>racial and ethnic identity</u> <u>options</u> including Middle Eastern North African
- Sexual Orientation and Gender Identity question on <u>Medicare Enrollment</u> Form
- State Of The Union memo to White House about content/focus



LWVUS 2023/2024 Actions

Climate Change/Environment

- Comments to CEQ on <u>National Environmental</u> <u>Policy Act(NEPA) implementation</u>
- Comments to CEQ on <u>Environmental Justice</u> <u>Scorecard</u>
- Comments to EPA on <u>methane air pollution</u>

Equal Rights Amendment (ERA)

 Urged <u>WHGPC to advise President to instruct</u> <u>Archivist to publish</u>

Gun Safety

 Comments to ATF on <u>definition of a firearms</u> <u>dealer</u>

Immigration

- Opposed movement toward an <u>asylum ban</u>
- Urged finalizing a proposed rule for <u>health</u> <u>coverage for DACA recipients</u>
- Comments opposing <u>immigration application</u> fee increases

Reproductive Justice

- Urged removal of anti-abortion <u>appropriations</u> rider
- Comments on <u>DoD abortion data collection</u>
