There. There are efforts across the country to remove voters from the rolls. Of course, we want clean rules everywhere, but it's a process and how you do it, and so we want to just make sure that, as folks are heading into the election cycle, but those barriers are removed and lessened so people have access to the ballot. And then we also just see things like, you know, misinformation, disinformation, traveling around the country in terms of when people can vote, how people can vote. And so the league is really, really working to combat that, putting out accurate information for voters to use for as they make their voting plans for November. So Selena, since 2020 there was an effort by a number of

impediments, some obstacles. What is your assessment of where that stands now, four years later, how are you how is your group trying to circumvent them? So we have worked really hard,

amazing and pushing back on legislation that limits the ability for people to vote. And so I think it's not that far off in terms of where we were in, 2020, unfortunately. But the thing is that we have voter registration. Is Critical people turning out to vote to ensure that the folks who represent their

registration, is enacting copie tarning out to vote to ensure that the rolls who represent their

community are elected are the most important actions that we can take at this time. And so, people who are in office, make the rules, whether it's at the state or the federal level. So, this is such a key day across the country to make sure that as many people eligible to vote can register and make sure that they're showing up for November 5.
