


State Legislative Landscape





Ballot Initiatives Overview





Ballot Initiatives Overview


Measures Qualified by Issue Area

Post-Election Advocacy Considerations

- Shifts in power in state legislatures
 - Anti-democracy v. Pro-democracy legislatures
- Governors & Secretary of State Races
 - Effects on executive branch policy
 - Effects on future democracy and election work
- Ballot Measure outcomes
 - Implementation
 - Challenges (e.g. litigation, legislative repeals)
- Lame duck and special sessions
 - Opportunities for passing legislation



Strategy and Prep

- SWOT Analysis of your League and state's legislative landscape
 - What are your League's current strengths? What weaknesses do you have?
 - What opportunities exist in your legislative or executive branches?
 - What poses a threat to your work and ability to advocate?
- Pre-filed bills
 - An opportunity to get ahead of the session
- Outline your legislative and advocacy priorities
 - Keep your priorities targeted and proportional to your capacity





Outlining Advocacy Plan

Goal Planning

What is my goal?

- What are your organizational priorities?
- What is getting in the way of achieving them?
- Who can help me overcome those challenges?
- What does success look like?

Action Planning

How do I get [party] to take [specific action] by [timeline]?

- What audiences am I talking to? Who is listening?
- Where + how am I relaying our message?
- Who am I mobilizing and how?





Executive and Regulatory Advocacy

- Alternative mode of advocacy when legislative environment is especially challenging
- An area of advocacy where laws are executed and implemented
- Opportunity to comment on proposed rulemaking, influence regulation development, and advising on executive order implementation





DEI & Other Advocacy Considerations

- Harm to Specific Groups of Voters
 - Did you consider the impact on X group?
 - Did you know the law in X state had X impact on X voters?
 - How do you plan to lessen the harm on X voters caused by this bill?
- Legislators' Justification for the Bill
 - What specific problem is the bill trying to solve? Examples of this problem?
 - How will this law fix the problem?
- Take lead from partners and affected community members
- Rally and lean on your allies

League In Action

The official LWV digital organizing platform that enables Leagues to build a digital community regardless of LWV membership.

LIA supporters can not only take action to empower voters and defend democracy but also share and invite their network into LWV's mission.







LWV Highlight: LWV Montana



Goal: To increase their impact during Montana's short and fast-paced Legislative session

Used OutreachCircle to:

- Provide updates to LWV membership
- Legislative updates with a set of actions for each supporter
- Build a Rapid Response LWV Muscle by being able to provide real-time updates on important legislation
- Added an OutreachCircle action at the end of their monthly League meeting to increase advocacy actions





LWV Highlight: LWV Kentucky

Goal: To Increase Lobby Day participation to leverage the League's people power


Used LIA for in-person attendees by:

- Provided logistical information (parking, directions, meeting room/location, schedule, etc.)
- Attendance check-in
- Push notifications for the start of events (press conference, etc.) conferences
- Lobby Day attendees were able to submit debrief/meeting notes after they met with legislators and staff
- Provide direct feedback on Lobby Day

Used LIA for virtual attendees by:

- Directly linked to education resources that the League has already created on the legislation they were following
- Click to call action allowing virtual attendees to call their legislators (same with email)
- Directly linked to key committee's live streams that members should tune into
- Ready to share messages to friends and family on why LWV was at the capitol
