COMPLAINT IN LIEU OF PREROGATIVE WRITS

Plaintiff, James Calderon, by way of Complaint In Lieu of Prerogative Writs, against Defendants, City of Jersey City Ward Commission ("The Commission"), and John Minella, Chairman, Sean J. Gallagher, Secretary, and Commissioners Daniel E. Beckelman, Paul Castelli, Janet Larwa, and Daniel Miqueli (hereinafter, "Commissioners" and collectively, "Defendants"), says:

PARTIES

- 1. Plaintiff, James Calderon, is a resident of the State of New Jersey, with a mailing address of 65 Lafayette Street Jersey City, New Jersey 07304.
- 2. Defendant, City of Jersey City Ward Commission ("The Commission"), is a public body organized under the laws of the State of New Jersey and defined by the New Jersey Open Public

Meetings Act ("OPMA"), with an address of City Hall, 280 Grove Street Jersey City, New Jersey 07302. N.J.S.A. § 10:4-8.

- 3. Defendant, John Minella, is Chairman of the City of Jersey City Ward Commission, with an address of City Hall, 280 Grove Street, Jersey City, New Jersey 07302.
- 4. Defendant, Sean Gallagher, is Secretary of the City Of Jersey City Ward Commission, an address of City Hall, 280 Grove Street, Jersey City, New Jersey 07302.
- 5. Defendant, Daniel E. Beckelman, is a Commissioner of the City Of Jersey City Ward Commission, an address of City Hall, 280 Grove Street, Jersey City, New Jersey 07302.
- 6. Defendant, Paul Castelli, is a Commissioner of the City Of Jersey City Ward Commission, an address of City Hall, 280 Grove Street, Jersey City, New Jersey 07302.
- 7. Defendant, Janet Larwa, is a Commissioner of the City Of Jersey City Ward Commission, an address of City Hall, 280 Grove Street, Jersey City, New Jersey 07302.
- 8. Defendant, Daniel Miqueli, is a Commissioner of the City Of Jersey City Ward Commission, an address of City Hall, 280 Grove Street, Jersey City, New Jersey 07302.

JURISDICTION AND VENUE

- 9. This Court has personal jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to the 2009 New Jersey Code Title 40 Municipalities and Counties § 40:44-14.
- 10. Plaintiff brings this action pursuant to the Rules Governing the Courts of New Jersey, Superior Court of New Jersey Rule 4:69 Actions in Lieu of Prerogative Writs and New Jersey's Open Public Meetings Act ("OPMA").
 - 11. All parties to this action are citizens of the State of New Jersey.

FACTUAL AND PROCEDURAL HISTORY

12. New Jersey's Open Public Meetings Act ("OPMA") ensures the right of its citizens to have adequate advance notice of and the right to attend all meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting the public is discussed or acted upon. N.J.S.A. § 10:4-7.

13. The State of New Jersey finds and declares that "the right of the public to be present at all meetings of public bodies, and to witness in full detail all phases of the deliberation, policy formulation, and decision making of public bodies, is vital to the enhancement and proper functioning of the democratic process; that secrecy in public affairs undermines the faith of the public in government and the public's effectiveness in fulfilling its role in a democratic society, and hereby declares it to be the public policy of this State to insure the right of its citizens to have adequate advance notice of and the right to attend all meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting the public is discussed or acted upon in any way except only in those circumstances where otherwise the public interest would be clearly endangered or the personal privacy or guaranteed rights of individuals would be clearly in danger of unwarranted invasion."

N.J.S.A. § 10:4-7.

14. The Commission is a public body, clearly defined as "...a commission, authority, board, council, committee or any other group of two or more persons organized under the laws of this State, and collectively empowered as a voting body to perform a public governmental function affecting the rights, duties, obligations, privileges, benefits, or other legal relations of any person, or collectively authorized to spend public funds including the Legislature, but does not mean or include the judicial branch of the government, any grand or petit jury, any parole board or any agency or body acting in a parole capacity, the State Commission of Investigation, the

Apportionment Commission established under Article IV, Section III, of the Constitution, or any political party committee organized under Title 19 of the Revised Statutes." N.J.S.A. § 10:4-8.

- 15. On September 16, 2021, Governor Philip D. Murphy promulgated the results of the 2020 Federal census. See Report of the Ward Commission, from the City of Jersey City, attached hereto as Exh. A, at 1.
- 16. On or about December 15, 2021, The Commission allegedly held an initial meeting (the "Initial Meeting"), where "The Commission concluded that the ward boundaries required adjustments..." and "with assistance of staff from the Board of Elections, scheduled working sessions to begin drafting proposals for new ward boundaries..." <u>Id</u>.
- 17. Pursuant to the OPMA, a meeting "includes any gathering whether corporeal or by means of communication equipment, which is attended by, or open to, all of the members of a public body, held with the intent, on the part of the members of the body present, to discuss or act as a unit upon the specific public business of that body. Meeting does not mean or include any such gathering (1) attended by less than an effective majority of the members of a public body, or (2) attended by or open to all the members of three or more similar public bodies at a convention or similar gathering." N.J.S.A. § 10:4-8.
- 18. On January 22, 2022, The Commission, acting through the Commissioners, voted on the approval of a new redistricting map of the wards of Jersey City that was created without public input during working session as mentioned in the Ward Commission report. See Exh. A at 3.
- 19. On January 22, 2022, the Commission, acting through the Commissioners, voted on the approval of a new redistricting map of the wards of Jersey City that was not in accordance with the criteria set forth in 2009 New Jersey Code Title 40 Municipalities and Counties § 40:44-14. Id.

- 20. N.J.S.A. § 40:44-14 mandates that the ward boundaries must be: 1) Compact; 2) Contiguous; and 3) the population of the most populous ward does not differ from the population of the least populous ward by the more than 10%. See N.J.S.A. § 40:44-14.
- 21. "Public business" means and includes all matters which relate in any way, directly or indirectly, to the performance of the public body's functions or the conduct of its business. N.J.S.A. § 10:4-8.

FIRST COUNT

THE COMMISSION VIOLATED THE NEW JERSEY OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT, N.J.S.A. § 10:4-17

- 22. Plaintiff repeats and makes a part hereto each and every allegation set forth in paragraphs 1 through 21 of the Complaint.
- 23. Between December 15, 2021 and January 22, 2022 the Commission held meetings as defined by N.J.S.A. § 10:4-8.
- 24. These meetings were described as "working sessions" in the January 22, 2022 Ward Commission Report. **Exh. A** at 1.
- 25. During these non-conforming meetings between December 15, 2021 and January 22, 2022, the Commission worked on and created a new ward map that was subsequently approved at a public meeting on January 22, 2022. **Id**., City of Jersey City Ward Map, at 10.
- 26. These "working sessions" had the "intent to discuss or act as a body on public business" which by definition of N.J.S.A. § 10:4-6, is a "public meeting."
- 27. As stated in N.J.S.A. §10:4-6, "it is not necessary that a meeting result in some action; mere discussion of public matters is enough to make it a public meeting."
- 28. A public body may discuss in a session closed to the public. These include legally confidential matters, purchase of realty and decisions that could adversely affect the outcome if

made public, pending litigation and contract negotiations, and employment matters. N.J.S.A. § 10:4-12(b).

- 29. The subject area of drawing new ward boundaries does not fall under the permitted exceptions stated in N.J.S.A. § 10:4-12(b).
- 30. No Public notice or agenda for these "working sessions" were made available to the public.
 - 31. The "working session" meetings were held in violation of the OPMA.

WHEREFORE all actions, including the new ward map created should be voided, subsequently voiding the vote on January 22, 2022 to approve this new map, as this meetings were non-confirming.

SECOND COUNT

THE COMMISSION APPROVED A NEW WARD MAP THAT IS NOT IN COMPLIANCE WITH N.J.S.A. § 40:44-14.

- 32. Plaintiff repeats and makes a part hereto each and every allegation set forth in paragraphs 1 through 31 of the Complaint.
- 33. The Commission approved a new ward map that is not compact or contiguous in violation of N.J.S.A. § 40:44-14.
- 34. The neighborhood of Lafayette, which is defined by the borders of the National Secondary Rail Line to the North, Liberty State Park to the east, Caven Point Avenue to the South and Garfield Avenue to the West, is split between Ward A and Ward F. See Exh. B.
- 35. The Street of Lafayette, which the neighborhood is named after, spans over seven (7) blocks in the center of the neighborhood. This street has been split between Ward A and Ward F. See Exh C

36. The Commission splitting the neighborhood and its named Street, proves that the ward map is not compact as mandated by N.J.S.A. § 40:44-14.

37. The Commission approved a map that is not contiguous or compact. See Exh. A at 10. In the Ward Commission Report the boundaries of each ward are described with respective deviations from their starting point. See Id. at 9. The ranges of deviations of Ward B through E are between 14-25 deviations along the border lines. Id. Ward A and F have 34 and 37 deviations respectively. These excess deviations in Ward A and F shows that these wards are not compact or contiguous. Id.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff requests the following relief:

- A. The Commission's vote to approve a redistricting map that was created in nonconforming meetings where the public was excluded from the discussion of Public business should be voided.
- B. That this Court enter an injunctive order or other remedy to ensure compliance with the provisions of the OPMA.
- C. That this Court finds that the action taken at the January 22, 2022 meeting did not conform to the provisions of OPMA and as a result, declare such action void.
- D. A judgment voiding the action of The Commission at the January 22, 2022, meeting.
- E. Judgment against Defendants, together with interest, costs of suit including court fees, and such other and further relief as this Court shall deem just and proper.

REPORT OF THE WARD COMMISSION

In accordance with the New Jersey Municipal Ward Law, <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40:44-9 et seq. and more specifically, <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40:44-16, the Ward Commission of the City of Jersey City (hereinafter "the Commission") hereby publishes the within report describing the new ward boundaries adopted at its January 22, 2022 meeting.

In accordance with N.J.S.A. 40:44-15, a certified copy of this report and a map of Jersey City featuring the new ward boundaries has been be filed in the Office of the County Clerk, the New Jersey Secretary of State and the Office of the City Clerk of the City of Jersey City.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

On September 16, 2021, Governor Philip D. Murphy promulgated the results of the 2020 Federal census. In accordance with N.J.S.A. 40:44-13, the Commission met on December 15, 2021 within the statutorily mandated ninety (90) day period following the Governor's promulgation. The Commission met in the office of the Hudson County Board of Elections to review the ward map adopted in 2012. This initial meeting was held in conformity with the Open Public Meetings Act, more commonly known as "The Sunshine Law". The Commission concluded that the ward boundaries required adjustment because the data from the 2020 census revealed that there was a 59% population deviation between most populous ward, Ward E, and the least populous ward, Ward D, which exceeded the maximum 10% population deviation allowed by N.J.S.A. 40:44-14. Consequently, Commissioners, with the assistance of staff from the Board of Elections, scheduled working sessions to begin drafting proposals for new ward boundaries which would conform to the criteria set forth in N.J.S.A. 40:44-14. This statute mandates that ward boundaries must be:

- 1. Compact;
- 2. Contiguous; and
- 3. The population of the most populous ward not differ from the population of the least populous ward by more than 10%.

N.J.S.A. 40:44-15 required that the Commission finalize a new ward map within thirty (30) days of its initial meeting. However, the Governor granted a one week extension to all ward commissions statewide to complete their work.

During their working sessions with staff from the Board of Elections, Commissioners utilized a proprietary mapping software which depicted the existing ward map featuring the census tracts

provided by the Federal government superimposed upon it. The Commissioners sought to craft a map that would (1) impose the least amount of demographic change to each ward while (2) lowering the deviation between the most populous ward and the least populous to the lowest possible percentage. By utilizing the proprietary mapping software, Commissioners could test various options by moving census tracts from one ward to another in an effort to re-distribute the population. The mapping software allowed the Commissioners to track, in real time, both the change in population between the wards as well as the change in demographics as these census tracts were moved. The map attached hereto as page 10 depicts what the Commission presented to the public.

In accordance with the <u>Open Public Meetings Act</u>, the Commission scheduled a public hearing on January 22, 2022 to consider the ward map produced by the working sessions. The ward map was adopted at the January 22, 2022 meeting.

FINDINGS OF FACT

Members of the public were presented with a copy of the proposed ward map as well as a comparison of the demographic changes between the 2012 ward map and the ward map proposed by the Commission. That demographic data is included below:

After the public hearing, the Commission concluded that the proposed new ward boundaries were both compact and contiguous and represented the least amount of changes demographically while lowering the population deviation between the most populous ward and the least populous ward to 1.8%; well below the maximum deviation allowed by N.J.S.A. 40:44-14. The Commission voted 6-0-1 to adopt the within map with Commissioners Beckelman, Castelli, Gallagher, Larwa and Minella voting in the affirmative. Commissioner Horton abstained.





